*Luke 1:1-4 Many have undertaken to draw up an account of the things that have been fulfilled among us, just as they were handed down to us by those who from the first were eyewitnesses and servants of the word. With this in mind, since I myself have carefully investigated everything from the beginning, I too decided to write an orderly account for you, most excellent Theophilus, so that you may know the certainty of the things you have been taught.*

Dear members and friends of Trinity Lutheran:

Merry Christmas to you all. And then Happy New Year to you all. And then, happy Epiphany to you all. Whew! So many new things are happening at this time of year.

New. We are in a new year, Year C now, which means Luke is our new main gospel that we will turn to during the new 2022 church year. Luke begins his gospel with something new too. Something new happened recently in Luke's life, and his intention is to give Theophilus and all of and us an orderly account of Jesus Christ, this God incarnate, so we may know the certainty of the new things we have been taught about God.

There is so much happening that's new in the world today. Our perception of truth may have changed. This is not a new thing. The new thing that Luke talks about is that truth is a man, Jesus Christ. This is the one that we just celebrated as God incarnate. During Luke's time, truth was as murky as it is today. Truth was whatever the people in power wanted the truth to be. Luke writes in 23:12 which is Jesus' trial scenes, "That same day Herod and Pilate became friends with each other; before this they had been enemies." Pilate is Roman: Herod was raised as a Jew. These two were on opposite sides. UNTIL! Until they discover that they are on the same side...they both want Jesus dead and they made it happen...temporarily They both executed their truth on the innocent Jesus and became friends.

Something new had happened. Yes, Jesus died because of what Herod and Pilate said and did. Both Pilate and Herod become friends because they both agreed with each other in this matter. But the truth is a person: Jesus. Yes, Jesus dies, AND then something new happened--Jesus is resurrected. The truth cannot be killed. The truth will be resurrected again. Truth lives.

Our lives are complex. We spend quite large portions of our lives wondering what it is that makes sense in our lives—we wonder what truth is for us. It seems like we are living in darkness so many times and we wonder which way we should go in order to find any twinkling of light. We continually look to the past as if it could help us in our present lives in hopes of a good future. We seek connections but simultaneously wonder if we'll be accepted by the other person, or maybe, if we can tolerate the other person. We seek newness.

Something new has happened, for us. Christ has come. Christ is risen. Christ is already in our future. When Christ came, he taught his disciples how to live. He taught them God's desires for how He wishes His people to care for each other. Luke did not keep this secret. He wrote all of this down for us to read so that we may live the way God wants. There are many people and institutions in our lives that are claiming that they have the correct way to live: there are many who want to guide, cajole, instruct and shape our lives. Luke's claim, and mine too, is that Jesus has shown us the way God wants us to live. Luke advocates for Jesus' way of living. I hope we all advocate for that.

It's a new calendar year. May we discover anew, how to live into the life God wishes for us, to hear and witness to the good news in our lives. Happy journeys to you in this new year and may you find joy along the way. Happy New Year.

## *Grow Faith, Serve God, Love Others*

**Welcome** by President Brian McNeill at 7:02 PM. Members present were Adam Kolander, Jason Heinzig, Toni Lindstrom, Maureen Erdman, Jason Anderson, Robert Neuman and Jodee Erickson. Also present were Bill Hoberg and Pastor Dale Degner. Absent was Diane Schuerman.

**Devotions** were from Deuteronomy by Pastor Dale. In response to a discussion at the last council meeting regarding Deuteronomy 28:63, Pastor Dale offered this explanation – As a parent gets upset with a child, so does God get upset with us, but He still loves us.

Walk humbly with God. We deserve God's justice, but we have a forgiving God.

**Pastor's Report** – Pastor Dale has the Advent and Christmas services planned and he is looking forward to Epiphany season. He has met with members who are asking whether church services will be done by zoom or other means. He will be showing the video "Luther" (sent out by Thrivent in 2003) to the confirmation classes. Pastor Dale has been attending Continuous Growth Pathway events for 45-60 minutes per session, twice per week. Most sessions can be done online. He has visited/called eight family units. He hopes to increase this number substantially in December. Reminders – Pastor's vacation is December 27 – January 2 and Donald Young (Gideon) will be here at Trinity on January 23.

### **Reports:**

**Secretary Jodee Erickson** – The November minutes were reviewed and approved by email.

**Financial Secretary Pam Anderson** – Motion by Jason H to approve with second by Toni. Motion carried.

**Treasurer Bill Hoberg** – November total income was \$17,336.33 and total expense was \$17,248.69.

Checking account balance as of November 30, 2021 was \$29,339.44.

Motion made by Robert to approve with second by Maureen. Motion carried.

### **Committee Reports:**

**Board of Education and Youth** – Did not meet. Sunday School Christmas Program is scheduled for Sunday, December 12, during worship service.

**Outreach and Community Relations (B.A.C.K. pack program)** – Did not meet.

**Property and Grounds** – Adam Fahje will do snow removal on the church parking lot. We need to call him if there is a funeral or special event during the week, otherwise he will keep it clear for Sundays.

Craig's will install the five new thermostats without the wifi capability.

Outside vents need to be installed for the bathroom and kitchen plumbing in the church which are currently vented into the attic. The committee will ask Craig's to look into doing that, preferably through the north wall as opposed to the roof.

**Parsonage sump pumps** – The city will permit sump pumps to drain into the sanitary sewer during the winter months with it draining to the curb in the spring, summer and fall.

This would prevent accidents due to ice buildup on the street. Hawley's has submitted a bid to install a valve and tubing which includes labor for \$590.00 for the sump pumps and a bid of \$250.00 to clean the floor drains as the drain in the north basement room has been backing up.

Toni made a motion to have the work done by Hawley's with a second by Jason H. Motion carried.

The parsonage garage door opener is not working. The committee will look into repairing it.

**Stewardship and Finance** – Did not meet. Work has begun on the budget.

**Worship and Music** – No report.

### **Discussions**

Mask wearing in church was discussed. Each person will decide whether to wear a mask.

It would be good to record services again. It is another way to reach out to the congregation. Pastor Dale and Brian will talk with Laura R regarding this.

There will be the option of traditional communion or use of the communion packets. Pastor Dale will give that option during communion. Toni will be the assisting deacon on Sunday, December 5. The Annual Meeting will be on January 16, 2022. Those whose terms will be ending are Brian McNeill, Adam Kolander and Jodee Erickson. If there are any specific items to be placed on the agenda, let Brian know by the January 5 meeting. Committee reports for the annual meeting are due in the office by December 16.

**Old Business** – As mentioned in the Property and Grounds report, Adam Fahje will be doing parking lot snow removal. Craig's will be installing the new thermostats.

**New Business** – Transfer out of Pastor Art and Brenda Wiese to Peace Lutheran Church of New London, Minnesota. Motion made by Adam to approve the transfer of Pastor Art and Brenda with a second by Jason A. Motion carried.

**Announcements** – December newsletter articles are due December 13. The next Church Council meeting is January 5, 2022 at 7:00 PM.
